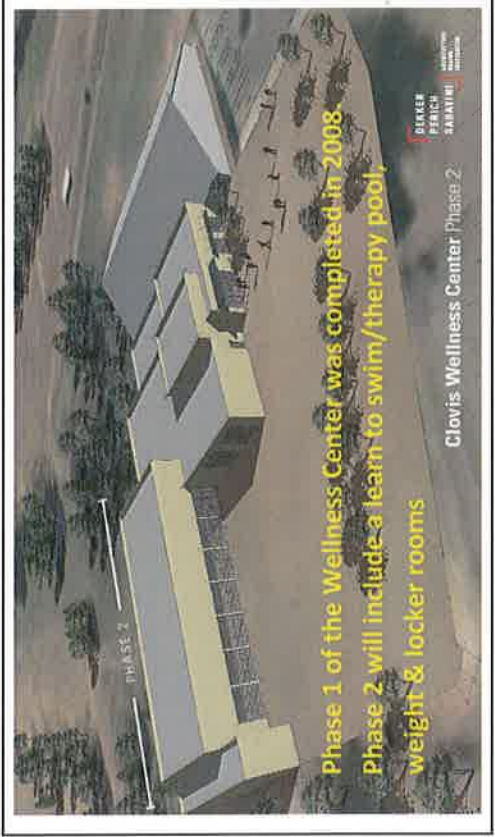
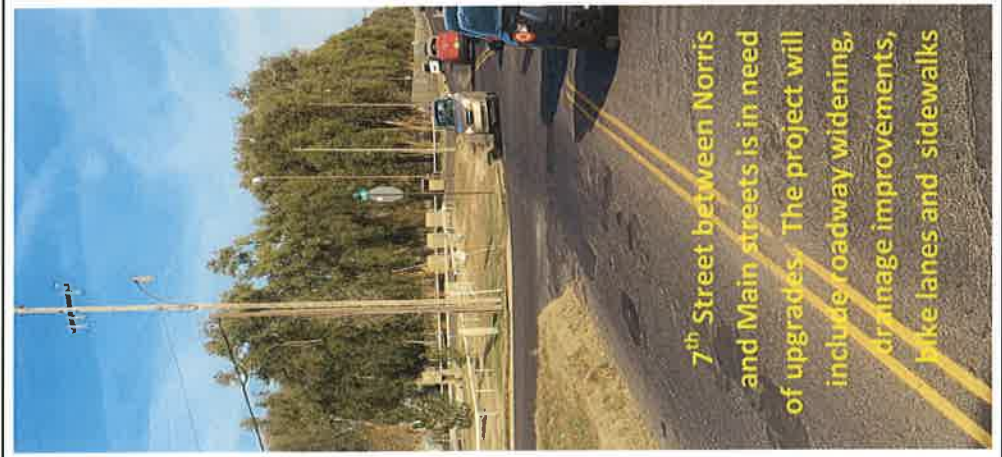
If all three bonds are approved the estimated property tax rate increase will be 7.80 mills. The impact for properties with the following values would be:

Q&A

Why is Clovis seeking GO bond funding?

Clovis has over \$73 million in outstanding infrastructure projects that need funding. The majority of New Mexico's larger communities fund projects with general obligation bonds. Funding projects with four year GO bonds will allow the City to fund projects without increasing gross receipts tax which would negatively impact business.

What is the term of the bonds? 12-13 years
